

2025-2026 Legislative Session Begins The 2025-2026 session of the Wisconsin Legislature officially began with its inauguration on Monday, January 6. This largely ceremonial day featured the swearing-in of all 99 members of the State Assembly to new two-year terms and the induction of newly elected members of the State Senate to four-year terms.

Leadership in both chambers remains unchanged from the conclusion of the previous session. Robin Vos returns as Assembly Speaker, with Representative Greta Neubauer continuing as Assembly Minority Leader. In the State Senate, Senator Devin LeMahieu retains his position as Majority Leader, while Senator Diane Hesselbein continues to serve as Minority Leader.

Notably, there are some new faces leading the housing committees. Senator Romain Quinn returns as the Senate Housing Chair, joined by freshman Senator Jamie Wahl of Green Bay, who has been named the ranking Democrat on the Senate Housing Committee. In the Assembly, housing committee leadership remains consistent, with Representative Rob Brooks serving as Chair and Representative Kalan Haywood as the ranking Democrat.

Governor Evers' Budget Address Set for

February 18

As is tradition, the introduction of the governor's budget bill marks the primary focus at the start of a new legislative session. This year, Governor Tony Evers will deliver his budget address to a joint session of the Wisconsin Legislature on February 18, outlining his state budget priorities.

Once the budget is introduced, it will be reviewed by the Joint Committee on Finance, which is controlled by Republicans with a 12-4 majority. Historically, the GOP-led committee has opted to rewrite its own version of the budget, incorporating elements of the governor's proposal that align with their priorities.

To become law, the same version of the state budget must be approved by both legislative chambers before being sent to Governor Evers for review. Evers wields one of the most powerful lineitem veto authorities in the country, a tool he has frequently used in past budget cycles.

The ultimate goal is for the governor to sign a new state budget before the start of the next fiscal year on July 1.

NAHB Files Suit Against HUD Energy Codes Mandate

NAHB and 15 state attorneys general have filed a complaint in the Eastern District of Texas seeking to stop the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) from adopting the 2021 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) and ASHRAE 90.1-2019 as the minimum energy-efficiency standards for certain single-family and multifamily housing programs. The lawsuit seeks to show that granting HUD and USDA authority to insure mortgages for new single-family homes and apartments only if they are built to the 2021 IECC was done in an unconstitutional manner.

Ordinance Reviews

As a free service, NAHB's Legal and Land Use staff assist members and HBAs by reviewing state and local ordinances and regulations relating to development and construction, including local zoning ordinances, comprehensive plans, subdivision regulations, complete streets ordinances, impact fee ordinances and state legislation.

The Legal staff examines and analyzes ordinances based on constitutional, statutory and case law considerations. Generally, ordinances are reviewed for statutory compliance, procedural and substantive due process considerations, Fifth Amendment takings issues and other legal deficiencies.

NAHB's Land Use staff also provides rigorous critical review and comments on the land use policy and implementation aspects of proposed and revised ordinances. Staff members also provide onsite assistance and expert witness testimony as needed.
